THE IRRESPONSIBLE BEHAVIOUR OF ELI'S SONS AND SAMUEL 1 SAMUEL 2: 12-25; 8: 1-9. Hophni and Phinehas were two brothers – sons of Eli the Priest in Shiloh– whom God punished for their contempt and immorality and lack of repentance.

His sons were assistant Priests who helped him with the work of God. Hophni and Phinehas did so many evil in the sight of God with hardened heart. Eli as we all know was a priest in Israel, he ruled Israel as a priest for forty years. He had two sons namely Hophini and Phinihas who were wayward they succeeded their father Eli as a result of his old age. His children exhibited the following characters

- 1.) They had no regard for God
- 2.) They were greedy and corrupt
- 3.) The treated the offspring of the lord with contempt
- 4.) They took the meat of sacrifice raw instead of allowing it to boil
- 5.) They took bribe and perverted justice
- 6.) They also lay with women who served at the entrance of the tent of meeting
- 7.) They blasphemed God

GOD'S PRONOUNCEMENT OF JUDGMENT ON ELI AND HIS SONS, 1 SAMUEL 2; 27-36; 3: 1-18.

God in his infinite mercy sent a message of doom to Eli through Samuel – the son of Hannah. He was dedicated to the Lord and thereby lived in the temple and serves alongside Eli's sons. Eli replied Samuel "He is the Lord; let Him do what seems Him good". It must be noted that Eli did his best to caution his children over their sins, but he did not back it up with action. His children refused to listen to him, there by refusing to report and return to the path of righteousness

These messages of doom are:

- i. Death of all young men in his family.
- **ii.** Eli would be troubled and look with envy on all blessings He would give to other people of Israel.

- **iii.** The only man in his house who would be spared and allowed to be a priest would weep bitterly.
- iv. All his other descendants would die violently.
- v. His two sons would die on the same day.
- vi. Any of his descendants who survived would have to go to the priest and ask for money and food, would beg to be allowed to help the priest in order to have something to eat.
